



Again the speed of vehicles is the main reason for concern at the junctions that have poor visibility.


SPEEDWATCH REPORT

- Approximately 1 in 20 small vehicles are speeding above 35mph.
- Some have been recorded at twice the speed limit but the average for speeding vehicles is around 45 mph.
- Swanwick Lane (that has traffic calming measures) and Botley Road have similar numbers of speeding vehicles.
- HGVs are not separately recorded but Stuart Kimber advises that they rarely speed and tend to slow the traffic.



3. How often do you cycle in Botley Road or Swanwick Lane.





Physical measures such as priority signs and speed bumps cannot be placed on main roads. Speed cameras are reserved for sites with a bad accident record due to the cost involved.


